

Lent Practices – Focus on Prayer

Parents are in the best position to teach prayer to children because they have daily contact with their children, and prayer, if it is going to make a difference in a person's life, needs to become a daily practice. Lent is the ideal time to focus on the practice of prayer. Lent is like a 40-day retreat that calls us to do something positive to enhance our relationships with God and with each other.

It is more important for prayers to be regular than elaborate. This is especially true for children. Use these simple prayers each day during Lent with your child to reinforce what you learned about Jesus' name at the session in church. Cut them out and put them in the places where they will be seen at the appropriate times for the prayers.

Morning

Jesus, you save us and give us this day. Thank you!


Mealtime

Jesus, you save us and give us food to strengthen us to do good things for others.

Bedtime

Jesus, you save us and give us peaceful rest. Thank you!

Home Activity Lent Practices – Fasting



Why do People Fast?

Lent is like a 40-day retreat that calls us to do something positive to enhance our relationships with God and with each other. Fasting is a traditional spiritual practice that shows up many times in the Bible. It is also encouraged in all of the major world religions. Fasting is something that even non-religious people do for health reasons. Look at the list below and discuss with your family why fasting is a valuable practice.

People fast because...

- ✓ They want to lose weight
- ✓ They want to focus on their hunger for God
- ✓ They want to live more simply
- ✓ They want to focus on their hunger for justice
- ✓ They want to improve their eating habits
- ✓ They want to focus on their hunger for love
- ✓ They want to remember that some people have little or no food and drink

Focus on Your Fast this Lent

Your family may decide to fast together from something that you all agree upon, or each individual family member may fast in his/her own unique way. Discuss how you will fast individually or as a family this Lent. Whichever option you choose, it will be good for all of you to help each other remain faithful to fasting during the season of Lent.

- Distribute paper and pencil to each family member.
- Ask each family member to write down what they will fast from this Lent.
- Invite each family member to list his/her reasons for fasting on a blank piece of paper.
- Keep these papers on your meal table during Lent.
- Review one of them at every meal and check in with that person during that
 meal to see how the fast is going and to offer encouragement in whatever way is
 needed. For example, affirm your child if the fast is going well or gently
 encourage her to begin again if she has not been faithful to the fast. Either way, it
 is important to keep the tone positive and encouraging. A negative experience
 will discourage the lifelong practice of fasting.

Home Activity February – Almsgiving

Engage your child in a discussion about people in need who live in your community. The need could be based upon a number of things. Some people need help with finances. Some people need someone to visit them. Some people need help with a project around their house or apartment. Teach your child that when they feel compassion for someone in need and do something to help, they are giving alms.

Many people give alms in secret. Here's a true story...

A woman's husband was dying of a terrible disease. Their bills were piling up because he could no longer work. She will never forget the day she opened her front door and found an envelope sitting outside the door. In the envelope was a short, unsigned note, "Please accept this gift to help you care for your family in your time of need." The note was attached to a stack of money totaling \$1,000.
